

**Siby K. George** is Professor of Philosophy at the Department of Humanities and Social Sciences, Indian Institute of Technology Bombay. His area of interest is contemporary European philosophy. He writes on themes such as development, technology, pain and dying, political ethics and subjectivity from a phenomenological vantage, emphasizing specifically on nonwestern and Indian contexts. He is author of *Heidegger and Development in the Global South* (Springer, 2015) and one of the editors of *Cultural Ontology of the Self in Pain* (Springer, 2016). He visited the Department of Philosophy, University of Guelph, and began research on the book *Heidegger and Development* during July-August 2010 under the Faculty Mobility Program of Shastri Institute. Currently, he is collaborating with Prof. John Russon, University of Guelph, on the project “*The Ethics of Teaching in Pluralistic and Unequal Societies*” under the Shastri Institutional Collaborative Research Grant (SICRG) 2016-17.
