INTRODUCTION

During the past year the forward movement recorded in last year's Annual Report has been maintained, both in respect of the Institute's programmes and in respect of the efforts to put its funding on a more secure footing.

The Institute continues to play an increasingly significant role in building academic and cultural links between India and Canada. During the past year, the following Indian scholars visited Canada under the Institute's Visiting Scholar Programme. Under Part A, Dr. R. Parthasarathy, a scholar of Tamil literature, lectured during the months of January and February, 1983 at the Universities of Alberta, British Columbia, Calgary, Carleton, Concordia, Manitoba, McGill, McMaster, Queen's, Regina and Toronto. Under Part B of the Programme, the Institute sponsored visits by a total of six scholars. Dr. Geeti Sen lectured at the Universities of British Columbia, Calgary, McGill, Toronto and Waterloo in September-October, 1983. In October, 1983 Dr. K. Mahadevan, Professor and Head, Department of Population Studies, S.V. University, visited the University of Alberta. In the month of November, 1983 Dr. Peter Hardy of the School of Oriental and African Studies, University of London, lectured at the Universities of McGill, Queen's and Toronto. In January, 1984 Dr. G. Bhattacharya of Kurukshetra University made visits to Brock, McMaster and Toronto. Over a two week period between late January and mid February, 1984 Dr. S. Chandrasekhar, a well-known demographer, who is also a former Minister of State for Family Planning in India, visited the Universities of Alberta, Carleton, Manitoba, McGill, Ottawa,

Queen's and Toronto. In April, 1984 Dr. S. R. Mehrotra of the University of Cambridge, England, lectured at the University of Toronto and at McMaster University under the auspices of the Institute. Professor H. C. Eastman, of the University of Toronto, made a highly successful lecture tour in India in December, 1983.

The programme of workshops and seminars continues to grow. The success of the Workshop on Educational Technology was noted in the report for 1982-83. In December, 1983, a Workshop in History was held in New Delhi in which the following distinguished Canadian historians attended under the Institute's sponsorship: Professor Carl Berger, University of Toronto; Professor Ramsay Cook, York University; Professor Cornelius Jaenen, University of Ottawa; and Professor H. V. Nelles, York University. By all accounts, this seminar was also extremely successful. After the seminar in New Delhi, these historians also went on a lecture tour to various Indian universities.

APPENDIX V

LIBRARY PROGRAMME

This final year of the Institute's three year grant has been very difficult for Shastri libraries. With a great deal of patience, hard work, and attention to detail, the Library Committee has prevented a further erosion of book funds and has maintained the prior year's level of receipts. The overexpenditure among libraries was approximately the same as 1982/83, and an increased number of libraries covered these overdrafts by extra dollar deposits, thus beginning the 1984/85 year in the black. Funding for library purchases was a difficult problem.

Because of the limited funds available and its effect on purchases, it has become apparent that the collections of the four Resource Libraries are being particularly affected and that they need increased support. For the first time in several years there has been a slight surplus in the Library Accounts due to a re-apportionment of Rupee funds between Library and Fellowship Programmes. In February 1984 the Chair of the Library Committee presented a detailed report to the Shastri Board on library funding, expenditures and receipts. The Board subsequently passed a motion that changed the share of the Library Programme's expenses from 63% to no more than 50%, so that the Fellowship and Library Programmes bore administrative costs equally. Several Support Libraries have expressed the opinion that this surplus money, even if small, should go to the Resource Libraries, since there should be at least one comprehensive collection of South Asian materials available for researchers in Canada. This cooperative attitude is a notable achievement, especially in times of retrenchment and restraint.

A number of other achievements occurred during the year. Blanket order profiles for McGill and the University of British Columbia were significantly revised.

The Library Programme has seen the inclusion of the first Atlantic member with funding for Memorial University Library. The

initial groundwork for special order acquisitions has now been set up, and Memorial has taken its place among the other ten Support Libraries.

The Library Committee revised the 1979 Survey of Indian and South Asian Collections. This report with short statements on each library's collection development outline has been written and will be included in the larger handbook on Indian and South Asian Studies now in preparation. Overall, the survey shows library holdings increasing 26% since 1979 to a total 294,000 volumes. This survey follows the format set up in 1979 by the National Library, and is based on Library of Congress subject classifications.

Mr. P.N. Malik was requested to provide new reports on library purchases and expenditures and these have formed the basis for renewed scrutiny and provide increasing information to the libraries on their acquisitions.

With an almost one-third increase in Rupee library funds from the new grant, automatic increases in for new members, and the eventual completion of a building in New Delhi to be owned by the Institute and the concomitant reduction of Rupee funds spent on rental accommodation, the Library Programme can be openly optimistic and confident in the future, and get about to the job of building good collections in support of ongoing teaching and research.

APPENDIX VII

CANADIAN STUDIES EXCHANGE PROGRAMME

Professor H. C. Eastman, Department of Economics, University of Toronto, spent approximately one month in India early in 1983 under the Canadian Studies Exchange Programme. He visited a number of Indian universities, gave lectures, and established contact with Indian scholars interested in developing programmes in Canadian Studies at their institutions.

During the 1984-85 academic year four Indian scholars will come to Canada under the above programme. Two of the four scholars have already been selected. They are Dr. Sushila Agarwal, Department of Political Science of the University of Rajasthan and Dr. M. K. Rakshit, Department of Economics of Presidency College, Calcutta.

During the first three weeks of December, 1983, Professors Cornelius Jaenen, University of Ottawa, Carl Berger, University of Toronto, H. V. Nelles and Ramsay Cook, York University, visited India under the auspices of the Shastri Indo-Canadian Institute to participate in a History Workshop. Also attending the Workshop were Indian historians from across the country. This Workshop was co-ordinated by Professor E. C. Moulton, University of Manitoba. The principal reason for the visit was to attend a Conference on Indo-Canadian History held at the University of New Delhi, and to lecture at several universities in various parts of India.

In May 1983 a group of Indian Educators and Technologists and a group of eight Canadian Educational Technologists offered a series of workshops in New Delhi on Educational Technology. The Canadian team visited the Space Research Centre at Ahmedabad and the Film Institute in Poona. The Resident Director, Professor Ratna Ghosh, co-ordinated the Workshop which was sponsored jointly by the Shastri Indo-Canadian Institute and the University Grants Commission, and hosted by Jamia Millia Islamia University. INTRODUCTION

Les progrès de l'année dernière tels que relevés dans le rapport annuel de la même période ont été maintenus aussi bien à l'égard des programmes de l'Institut qu'à l'égard de ses efforts de consolider la base financière.

L'Institut continue à jouer un rôle de plus en plus important dans l'élaboration des liens académiques et culturels entre les Indes et le Canada. L'année dernière les chercheurs Indiens suivants ont donné des conférences à diverses universités Canadiennes sous les auspices de l'Institut.

Dans la partie A du programme, le Dr. R. Parthasarathy, chercheur en littérature Tamil a donné des conférences les mois de janvier et de février 1983 aux universités suivantes: Alberta, la Colombie Britannique, Calgary, Carleton, Concordia, Manitoba, McGill, McMaster, Queen's, Régina et Toronto.

Dans la partie B du programme, l'Institut a patroné les visites de 6 chercheurs. Le Dr. Gaeti Sen a donné des conférences aux universités de la Colombie Britannique, de Calgary, de McGill, de Toronto et de Waterloo les mois de septembre et octobre 1983. Au mois d'octobre 1983, le Professeur Dr. E. Mahadevan, chef du Département des Etudes Demographiques de l'Université S.V., a visité l'université de l'Alberta. Au mois de novembre 1983, le Dr. Peter Hardy du Département des Etudes Orientales et Africaines de l'Université de Londres, a donné des conférences aux universités de McGill, Queen's et Toronto. En janvier 1984, le Dr. G. Bhattacharya de l'Université de Kurukshetra a visité les universités de Brock, McMaster et Toronto. Durant la fin du mois de janvier et le début du mois de février et pour une période de 15 jours, le Dr. S. Chandrasekhar, le démographe de ronon et ancien ministre Indien pour le Planning familial, a visité les universités de l'Alberta, de Carleton, de McGill, d'Ottawa, de Queen's et de Toronto. Au mois d'avril 1984, le Dr. S.R. Mehrotra de l'Université de Cambridge en Angleterre, a donné des conférences à l'Université de Toronto et à l'Université de McMaster sous les auspices de l'Institut. Au mois de décembre 1983, le professeur H.C. Eastman de l'Université de Toronto a complété une tournée très réussie aux Indes où il a donné des conférences.

Le programme d'ateliers de travail et de séminaires continue de s'étendre. Le succès de l'atelier de travail sur la Technologie de l'Education fut mentionné dans le rapport annuel 1982-83. Au mois de décembre 1983, un atelier de travail sur l'Histoire, sous le patronage et avec l'assistance de l'Institut s'est tenu à la Nouvelle Delhi. Y ont participé les historiens Canadiens suivants: le Professeur Carl Berger de l'Université de Toronto, le Professeur Ramsay Cook de l'Université de York, le Professeur Cornelius Jaenen de l'Université d'Ottawa, et le Professeur H.V. Nelles de l'Université de York. Au dire de tous, cet atelier de travail remporta un excellent succès. Après l'atelier de travail de la Nouvelle Delhi, ces historiens distingués ont fait la tournée des Indes où ils ont donné des conférences dans plusieurs universités.

La Conférence Nord-Sud, longtemps attendue, s'est tenue à l'Université de Calgary du 13 au 15 mai 1984. Elle a attiré des académiciens distingués non seulement des Indes et du Canada mais aussi de la Suède et du Royaume-Uni. Les fonds ont été obtenus des sources suivantes: l'Alberta Cultural Heritage Foundation, l'Agence Canadienne du Développement International (ACDI), le gouvernement des Indes et l'Université de Calgary. Encore une fois, cette conférence où environ 35 personnes y assistèrent fut jugée très stimulante. Les préparations sont en cours pour un atelier de travail sur La Société, la Technologie et le Développement, qui aura lieu à Jaipur au mois de décembre 1984.

On constate des progrès considérables dans la promotion des niveaux de financement de l'Institut. Les 10.000 dollars d'augmentation du Ministère des Affaires Extérieures, objet d'une longue attente, furent reçus et sont reconnus avec gratitude. La réponse du gouvernement des Indes fut encore plus agréable. Notre subvention a été établie sur une base quinquennale, ce qui signifie que le niveau annuel moyen de financement augmentera de 50% au delà du niveau de la période précédente de subvention. D'autre part, le principe de la hausse automatique du niveau de l'aide due à l'inflation et en vue de soutenir le programme de bibliothèques a été officiellement reconnu. Tout cela caractérise des étapes marquantes. L'ACDI et le gouvernement Indien se sont mis d'accord pour faire construire le siège permanent de l'Institut à la Nouvelle Delhi, en se partageant les frais moitié moitié. La quote-part de l'ACDI estimée à 165.000 dollars a été déjà versée.

CONCLUSION

Le succès continu de l'Institut dépend du rôle d'un grand nombre de personnes qui participent à ses activités. Il est approprié de rendre hommage aux rôles de Mme. A. de la Ronde et le personnel de son bureau à Calgary, et de Monsieur P.N. Malik et le personnel du bureau de la Nouvelle Delhi, pour avoir visé à promouvoir les activités de l'Institut au cours des dernières années. De même, il est approprié de faire mention des personnes suivantes pour leurs travaux:

- le Professeur Balbir S. Sahni, le Directeur Résident pour l'année 1983-84, qui grâce à ses efforts fut l'élément principal de la faveur et du succès remportés à la Nouvelle Delhi, l'année précédente.
- Les membres du Conseil d'Administration pour leur persévérance tout au long d'une année pénible et difficile.
- la bonne volonté et l'appui des personnes suivantes:
