INTRODUCTION

The year surveyed in this report has been one of significant progress in the context of continued financial stringencies and uncertainty.

The reciprocal flow of scholars between India and Canada has continued to expand. The summer programme held in India under the directorship of Professor David Miller of Concordia University and Dr. S. P. Gupta of the University of Delhi was, by all accounts, successful. Professor B. N. Goswamy was finally able to undertake his long anticipated visit during the fall of 1982, and was enthusiastically received at all the number institutions that were included in his itinerary. Professor Iqbal Narain, Vice-Chancellor of the Banaras Hindu University, also visited a number of institutions as part of a group sponsored by the International Development Research Centre in connection with the annual meetings of the Canadian Asian Studies Association. At a number of places the Shastri Indo-Canadian Institute played an important part in facilitating his visit. Professor Garth Stevenson, of the Department of Political Science of the University of Alberta, lectured in India in the spring of 1983 under the Canadian Studies Programme. Professor H. C. Eastman, of the Department of Economics, University of Toronto, is scheduled for a visit in December, 1983. Arrangements are now under consideration to make possible a lecture tour in Canada by Professor P. C. Joshi of the Institute of Economic Growth, Delhi, and Professor T. N. Madan of the same Institute who plans to be at Harvard next year.

After a period of long anticipation it is expected that a modest increase in our level of funding will be granted by the Department of External Affairs. While it falls far short of our quest for some sort of cushion against continuing inflation, the increase, when it comes, will be greatly welcome. Negotiations are in progress in India for a renewal and augmentation of our rupee grant from the Government of India and, by all accounts, we have reasons for optimism. When that happens, we hope to improve the fellowships and library acquisitions programmes whose real levels have suffered inevitable cutbacks due to cost increases.

The programme of workshops and seminars has also showed remarkable progress. The workshop in Canadian literature was noted in the report last year. In the fall of 1983, four historians from Canada are scheduled to participate in a programme of seminars and workshops in Canadian history in New Delhi. This will be the second workshop of this kind since the inception of the Canadian Studies Programme. An extraordinarily important event took place in May, 1983, when eight Canadian specialists and over thirty Indian specialists participated in a joint week-long workshop in education technology in New Delhi. The Conference, held jointly under the auspices of the Shastri Indo-Canadian Institute and the University Grants Commission, was inaugurated by the Education Minister and received extensive media coverage. Dollar funding from C.I.D.A. and rupee funding from U.G.C. is gratefully acknowledged.

CONCLUSION

The continuing success of the Institute depends on the co-operation of a large number of people involved in its activities. Among these I wish to make particular mention of (1) Professor Ratna Ghosh, Resident Director (1982-83), whose efforts were directly responsible for the favour and success we have enjoyed in New Delhi during the past year; (2) Members of the Executive Committee who have persevered through a hard and trying year; (3) Mrs. K. de la Ronde and the Calgary office staff and Mr. P. N. Malik and the staff of the New Delhi office but for whose continued effectiveness the Institute cannot operate smoothly and last but not least (4) the good will and support given to us by Mr. M. R. Sivaramakrishnan, High Commissioner for India; Mr. John Hadwen, High Commissioner for Canada in New Delhi; Mr. L. Perinbam, C.I.D.A.; Messrs. P. Charpentier, W. T. Delworth, and A. G. Vincent in the Canadian Department of External Affairs; and Mr. J. Maybee, Chairman of the Canadian Advisory Council.

APPENDIX V
LIBRARY PROGRAMME

In 1982/83 the Library Committee Members have dealt with a series of problems and yet worked out solutions effectively. General difficulties affecting research libraries today also affect the Shastri Library Programme - declining book funds, rising administrative and staff expenses, and complex processing routines. To the cost of material purchased one also adds the cost of cataloguing and circulation, often using the latest technologies.

But by questioning existing procedures and adopting new ones the libraries have been able to make the best use possible of declining resources. Cooperation and communications have been essential in this regard.

We are seeking out new methods of networking with the Library of Congress in New Delhi. We have surveyed our own collections. We have set priorities. Our goals are to 1) raise the level of funding for library materials; 2) improve acquisitions routines in India; 3) strengthen library collections; and 4) inform and develop the Library Committee membership, and to support current projects of the Institute.

The Committee's activities have been substantial. Old and new members alike have reassessed and surveyed their acquisitions. The speed and timeliness of reports from the New Delhi office have increased. There has been an increase in the correspondence and reports from the Chairman to the other participants and to New Delhi.

New acquisitions routines were implemented for the University of Regina which began selecting material on a Special Order basis in August, 1982. The Resource Libraries for the most part continue to use blanket order and special order plans; Programmes Support Libraries generally use special orders. This and the following information was gathered in a survey done in January of this year. The Resource Libraries use blanket orders because of savings in staff and in book selection. Support Libraries on special orders do so because they wish to exercise more control over the materials purchased. Both types of libraries consciously try to make their money go as far as possible.

Each library monitors its receipts and assesses the quality of material and its relevance. This is a hidden benefit that each library contributes to the Institute's policy of making Indian materials available for scholars and users across Canada.

A major concern this year has been the reduced amount of money available for the purchase of library materials.

Receipts are lower than last year. Overexpenditures both uncontrolled and deliberate are higher. Overall allocations are stagnant. The rate of inflation in India for books was 20%. The rise of administrative expenses to staff of the New Delhi office was a record 37% of library allocations.

To cope with this, some libraries have suspended all shipments and some have reimbursed their rupee account with dollars. Additional funds were directed towards the Library Programme this summer, but this is not sufficient. At the end of March, 1983 the Library Programme was almost Rs. 275,000 over its allocations.

It is very difficult to champion the cause of membership when the libraries pay bills and no books are bought. In this light it is important to recognise the contribution to South Asian studies that libraries make when they send in additional payments.

In September 1982 the Library Committee was fortunate to meet with Mr. P. N. Malik, the Administrative Director of the New Delhi office. His visit cleared up a lot of misconceptions contributed greatly to better communications between the members. Mr. Malik gave a history of the Library Programme and described certain routines and procedures of the New Delhi office. He also set down some guidelines on reports, grant periods and allocations which have been useful since September, both to the libraries and to Mr. Malik.

Mr. Malik's visit has also increased our expectations. As more details of the procedures and decisions of the New Delhi office are reports, improvements are often suggested. This flow of information between New Delhi and the Library Committee must be kept up if the programmes are to succeed and if scholarly resources are to be developed.

It is most important also to maintain discussions between the Board of Directors and the Library Committee when decisions are made by the Board that affect the Library Programme, especially when decisions affect financial allocations.

The Institute has enhanced its special programmes since its inception, and perhaps in the future the priorities of the Library Programme will have to be reassessed, in relation to the new goals and objectives of the Institute.

INTRODUCTION

L'année que couvre le présent rapport a été marquée par d'importants progrès, malgré l'incertitude et les restrictions budgétaires qui continuent de nous affecter.

Les échanges universitaires entre l'Inde et le Canada ont poursuivi leur expansion. La session d'été qui s'est déroulée en Inde sous la gouverne de M.M. David Miller, professeur à l'Université Concordia, et S. P. Gupta, PhD, de l'Université de Delhi, a été un succès complet. Le professeur B. N. Goswamy a finalement pu entreprendre une tournée longuement préparée, durant l'automne 1982 : il a été reçu chaleureusement par toutes les institutions membres qui l'avaient invité. M. Iqbal Harsain, professeur et vice-chancelier de l'Université hindoue de Bénarès, a, lui aussi, visité quelques universités dans le cadre d'échanges parrainés par le Centre de recherches sur le développement international à l'occasion des assemblées annuelles de l'Association canadienne d'études asiatiques. Dans bien des cas, l'Institut indo-canadien Shastri a joué un rôle de premier plan pour faciliter cette visite. M. Garth Stevenson, professeur au département de Sciences politiques de l'Université de l'Alberta, a prononcé une série de conférences en Inde, au printemps 1983, dans le cadre du programme d'études canadiennes. M. H. G. Eastman, professeur au département d'économie de l'Université de Toronto, doit en faire autant en décembre 1983. On prépare actuellement une tournée de conférences au Canada par M. P. C. Joshi, professeur à l'institut du développement économique de Delhi, et M. T. N. Madan, professeur au même institut, qui projette de visiter Harvard l'an prochain.

Après une longue période d'attente, on s'attend à ce que le secrétariat d'État aux Affaires extérieures accorde une hausse modeste de ses subventions à l'institut : bien qu'elle soit très en deçà de nos besoins pour parer à l'inflation, cette hausse sera éventuellement bienvenue. En Inde, les pourparlers se poursuivent en vue du renouvellement et de l'accroissement de notre subvention en roupies de la part du gouvernement indien et nous avons toutes les raisons d'être optimistes. Le soient venu, nous comptons bonifier les programmes

de bourses et d'aide aux bibliothèques qui ont subi d'inevitables dommages causés par l'inflation.

Le programme d'ateliers et de séminaires a, lui aussi, connu un progrès remarquable. L'atelier de littérature canadienne a été souligné dans le précédent rapport annuel. Durant l'automne 1983, quatre historiens canadiens doivent participer à une série de séminaires et d'ateliers sur l'histoire du Canada à la Nouvelle-Delhi. Il s'agira de la seconde série du genre depuis la création du programme d'études canadiennes. Un événement de toute première importance s'est déroulé en mai 1983 : huit experts canadiens et une trentaine d'indiens ont tenu ensemble un atelier d'une semaine sur la pédagogie, à la Nouvelle-Delhi. Cette conférence, organisée conjointement par l'Institut Indo-canadien Shastri et la Commission indienne des subventions universitaires, a été inaugurée par le ministre de l'Éducation et très bien reçue par la presse indienne. Nous tenons à remercier l'A.C.D.I. et la Commission indienne qui ont aidé à financer cette conférence.

CONCLUSION

L'avenir de l'institut dépend de la coopération des nombreuses personnes qui s'intéressent à ses activités. Entre tous, je tiens à remercier : M. Ratna Ghosh, professeur et directeur résident (1982-1983), dont les efforts nous ont valu le succès à la Nouvelle-Delhi durant l'année écoulée; les membres du Comité exécutif pour leur persévérance au cours de cette année difficile; Madame Kay de la Ronde et son personnel du bureau de Calgary, ainsi que M. P. N. Malik et ses employés du bureau de la Nouvelle-Delhi, dont les services efficaces sont essentiels à la bonne marche de l'institut; et, finalement, la collaboration et l'appui que nous ont accordés leurs Excellences M. R. Sivaramakrishnan, Haut Commissaire de l'Inde à Ottawa, et John Hadwen, Haut Commissaire du Canada à la Nouvelle-Delhi; MM. I. Perinbar, de l'A.C.D.I.; P. Charpentier, M. T. Delworth et A. G. Vincent, du secrétariat d'État du Canada aux Affaires extérieures; et M. J. Mayben, président du Conseil consultatif canadien.

À cours de 1982-1983, les membres du Comité des bibliothèques ont réussi à trouver des solutions à une variété de problèmes. Les difficultés qu'éprouvent toutes les bibliothèques de recherche touchent aussi bien le programme d'aide aux bibliothèques de l'Institut Shastri : diminution des fonds d'acquisition, accroissement des frais de gestion et de personnel, mécanismes de plus en plus complexes. Il faut ajouter aux achats les frais de catalogage et de diffusion, souvent au moyen des techniques les plus avancées.

Pourtant, en remettant en question les systèmes en vigueur et en adoptant de nouvelles approches, les bibliothèques ont pu utiliser au maximum des ressources décroissantes. En ce sens, la collaboration et les communications se sont avérées essentielles.

Nous cherchons de nouvelles méthodes d'échange avec la Bibliothèque du Congrès à la Nouvelle-Delhi. Nous avons fait l'inventaire de nos propres collections et établi nos priorités. Nos objectifs sont : 1) d'accroître les fonds d'acquisition des bibliothèques; 2) d'améliorer le processus d'acquisition en înde; 3) de renforcer les collections des bibliothèques; et 4) d'informer les membres du Comité des bibliothèques et, si possible, d'accroître le nombre; d'appuyer, enfin, les projets actuels de l'institut.

Le Comité a été très actif. Les membres, anciens et nouveaux, ont réévalué leurs acquisitions. Les rapports venant du bureau de la Nouvelle-Delhi se sont faits plus rapides et plus précis. La correspondance s'est accrue entre le président, les autres membres et la Nouvelle-Delhi.

À l'Université de Regina, on a mis en place un nouveau mode d'acquisition : depuis août 1982, le choix des ouvrages se fait sur la base de commandes spéciales. La plupart des bibliothèques de référence utilisent toujours les formules de commandes générales et spéciales, tandis que les bibliothèques d'appoint se servent plutôt de commandes spéciales. Ces renseignements et ceux qui suivent sont le résultat d'un sondage effectué en janvier cette année. Les bibliothèques de référence préfèrent les commandes générales qui leur épargnent des frais de personnel et de choix des ouvrages. Les bibliothèques d'appoint, pour leur part, préfèrent les commandes spéciales qui leur permettent d'exercer un meilleur contrôle sur les ouvrages commandés. Toutes les bibliothèques tentent, en somme, d'utiliser le mieux possible les fonds dont elles disposent.

Chaque bibliothèque vérifie ses acquisitions et évalue les ouvrages sur les plans de la qualité et de la pertinence. Il s'agit là d'un avantage caché : chaque bibliothèque renforce l'objectif de l'institut qui est de rendre le plus d'ouvrages indiens disponibles aux chercheurs et autres utilisateurs à travers le Canada.

L'une des principales préoccupations, cette année, est la réduction du budget alloué à l'achat d'ouvrage et autre matériel de bibliothèque.

Les fonds sont moins généreux que l'an dernier, tandis que les déboursés au delà du budget, accidentels ou délibérés, sont plus élevés. Dans l'ensemble, les allocations varient peu. En Inde, le taux d'inflation pour les livres a été de 20%. Au bureau de la Nouvelle-Delhi, la croissance des frais d'administration consentis au personnel a atteint un record : 37% des allocations à la bibliothèque.

Face à cette situation, certaines bibliothèques ont suspendu toute expédition; certaines ont remboursé leur compte en roupies avec des dollars. Des fonds additionnels ont été consentis au programme d'aide aux bibliothèques, cet été, mais ce n'est pas encore suffisant. À la fin de mars 1983, le programme d'aide aux bibliothèques avait dépassé son budget de quelque 275.000 roupies.

Il est très difficile d'accroître le nombre de membres alors que les bibliothèques paient les factures sans acheter d'ouvrages. Il nous semble donc très important de souligner la contribution aux études sud-asiatiques qu'apportent les bibliothèques lorsqu'elles effectuent des paiements additionnels.

En septembre 1982, le Comité des bibliothèques a eu la chance de rencontrer M. P. N. Malik, directeur résident du bureau de la Nouvelle-Delhi. Cette visite a permis de clarifier plusieurs points obscurs et d'améliorer de beaucoup les communications entre les membres. M. Malik a fait l'historique du programme d'aide aux bibliothèques et défini pour nous les modes de fonctionnement du bureau de la Nouvelle-Delhi. De plus, il a établi certaines directives touchant les rapports, les périodes de subvention et les budgets, mesures en vigueur depuis septembre au profit des bibliothèques et de M. Malik.

La visite de M. Malik a également stimulé nos attentes. À mesure que les méthodes et décisions du bureau de la Nouvelle-Delhi nous sont rapportées, nous pouvons proposer des améliorations. Ces échanges de renseignements entre la Nouvelle-Delhi et le Comité des bibliothèques devront continuer pour que le programme soit un succès et que les ressources à la disposition des chercheurs puissent s'accroître.

Il est aussi de première importance que les consultations se poursuivent entre le Conseil d'administration et le Comité des bibliothèques, lorsque les décisions du Conseil touchent le programme d'aide aux bibliothèques, notamment en matière budgétaire.

L'institut n'a pas cessé, depuis sa fondation, d'apporter des améliorations à ses programmes spéciaux. Peut-être devrons-nous, éventuellement, réévaluer les priorités du programme d'aide aux bibliothèques en fonction des nouveaux principes et objectifs de l'institut.
